

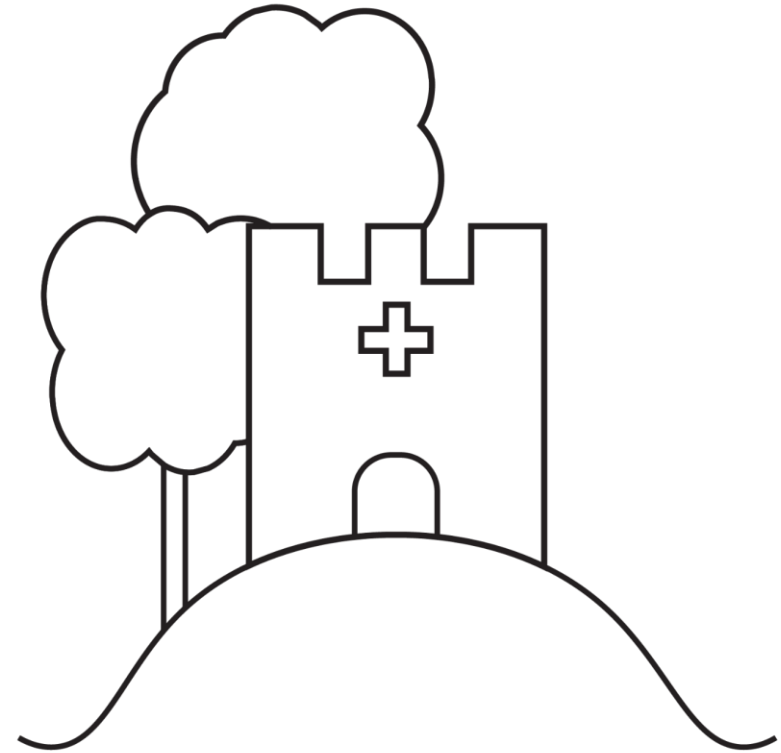

Castlewood is a school with the community at its heart. A welcoming and inclusive school, where children love to learn and are proud of being part of a happy, caring community. Our school has a highly-skilled and experienced staff team, whose dedication demonstrates the commitment to see every child achieve success and achieve their full potential.

The school has extensive facilities including: a beautiful nature area, large playing field, daily mile track, sensory room, two libraries, Clevertouch white boards in every classroom, an outdoor classroom as well as additional flexible classroom space.



Community Partners



The Supporters of Castlewood School (SOCS) arrange a variety of events throughout the year, which bring the community together and raise funds. These are donated to the school to develop the learning environment and enhance pupil experience. In the past few years, SOCS have raised funds to fully fund the new Daily Mile track, the outdoor classroom, providing new ICT resources and musical instruments. Their generosity also funds significant moments for our pupils such as Christmas pantomime performances, Leavers' hoodies and other magical moments over the year.



Castlewood is a proud and active member of West Horsham Schools Network. This provides partnership and collaboration opportunities for Castlewood and its staff. Castlewood staff have led a number of key initiatives as part of the network, and have benefitted from collaborating with other local schools and professionals through activities such as: headteacher forums, access to a Primary Mental Health Worker, shared INSET and development days, moderation exercises and regular forums to share best practice (SENDCos, bursars, subject leads).

Monitor school finances to maintain strong position against backdrop of education sector challenges, identify and assess future options for Castlewood in relation to academies agenda.

Job Description: Class teacher

Main purpose

The class teacher will:

- Fulfil the professional responsibilities of a teacher, as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document
- Meet the expectations set out in the Teachers' Standards



Duties and responsibilities

Teaching

- Plan and teach well-structured lessons to assigned classes, following the school's expectations with regards to plans, curriculum and schemes of work
- Assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievements of assigned pupils, making accurate and productive use of assessment
- Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of pupils
- Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils
- Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge

Whole-school organisation, strategy and development

- Contribute to the development, implementation and evaluation of the school's policies, practices and procedures, so as to support the school's vision and values
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- Work with others on curriculum and pupil development to secure co-ordinated outcomes
- Provide cover, in the unforeseen circumstance that another teacher is unable to teach

Southwater is large, and growing, village situated outside Horsham, West Sussex.

A friendly village with a strong community spirit, Southwater is located on the Downs Link connecting the North and South Downs. There is a country park which provides a great place for water sports as well other community facilities within the village.

The village comes together throughout the year for community events such as Bonfire Night and the Southwater Christmas Festival, as well as marking key national events such as Remembrance Sunday.

Castlewood shares strong links and connections with both Southwater Infant Academy and Southwater Junior Academy, as well as the many nurseries and early years childcare settings which operate locally.

With regular buses to Horsham, and with onward travel to Gatwick Airport (30 mins) and London (50 mins), Southwater is well connected to the South East.
